CLEAN BREAK CONTINUES ITS 40TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS WITH A SECOND SEASON FEATURING A DONMAR WAREHOUSE CO-PRODUCTION, A METHUEN ANTHOLOGY OF MONOLOGUES, A PRODUCTION TOURING THE UK IN A PRISON VAN PLUS TALKS, EVENTS AND WORKSHOPS

Clean Break continues its 40th anniversary year following the success of its Spring season, which opened with the sold-out run of *Inside Bitch* at the Royal Court Theatre. The company announces a second season of work to include:

- The launch of *Rebel Voices*, an anthology of 40 monologues for women by women, from across 40 years of Clean Break, published by Methuen (May)
- Sweatbox, the revival of Chloë Moss's play performed in a prison van at Chichester Festival Theatre and travelling across the UK (from June)
- Plays by Sonya Hale and Natasha Marshall at HighTide Festival (September)
- The full-length premiere of [BLANK], a new play by Alice Birch, a Donmar Warehouse and Clean Break co-production (October-November, press night: 17 October)
- A series of talks and events featuring conversations with Clean Break's Founders, Southall Black Sisters, Deborah Coles and Sonali Naik QC

Anna Herrmann and Róisín McBrinn, Joint Artistic Directors: We are delighted to be announcing Season Two of our year of celebration. At the heart of this season, we are coproducing with the Donmar a play that originated at Clean Break with two of the country's leading theatre artists - Alice and Maria. This feels like a truly bold way to make as much noise as possible about who we are, where we are at, and the change we want to see for women affected by the criminal justice system.

There are also wonderful opportunities to reflect on Clean Break's impact over the past 40 years through our collection of talks, our monologue book to be published by Methuen and a heritage project which will initially be presented touring alongside Sweatbox in a prison van. We are so proud to be continuing to change women's lives through theatre at this pivotal moment of our history.'

Clean Break celebrates 40 years of producing ground-breaking women writers and writing by its Members with an anthology of 40 monologues from 40 Clean Break voices. Including monologues by Alice Birch, Theresa Ikoko, Lucy Kirkwood, Bryony Lavery and Winsome Pinnock this collection goes some way to embodying Clean Break's extraordinary canon and offers an exceptional resource for women actors of all ages.

To mark the release of the anthology, Clean Break will host an evening of readings highlighting the rich tapestry of Clean Break's history of working with some of the most vibrant, daring women writers in British society, as performed by some of the UK's most treasured women actors. Cast includes: Jackie Clune, Michelle Greenidge, Jennifer Joseph, Ann Mitchell and Lia Williams.

Clean Break and Southall Black Sisters were both founded in 1979, the end of the decade of the women's movement, and the year that Margaret Thatcher came to power. BEHIND THE SCENES

When not on stage, Members are participating in a range of projects with leading partner organisations and female artists. These include a newly formed writers' group in partnership with Soho Theatre, making a film for London Festival of Architecture to be screened in June, an upcycling project with London College of Fashion, as well as volunteering as archivists as Clean Break delves into the past stories of the Company. Clean Break will also be delivering theatre workshops in women's centres across the capital for partners Women in Prison and Advance Minerva.

LEADERSHIP ACTIVITY

A programme of one-day training courses will be available across the season. Hosted in Clean Break's north London studios, these will provide artists and practitioners the opportunity to learn about Clean Break's unique approach to working with women affected by the criminal justice system. Training will include work with young women, traumainformed practice and writing for theatre in prisons. Alongside these days, bookings will be taken from Universities to share best practice with students in related areas of study. Bookings will also be taken for *Sounds like an Insult*, by Vivienne Franzmann; a play and accompanying workshop which highlights the challenges facing women with complex mental health needs. This will be touring later in the season and suitable for conferences and training events for staff working frontline with women. Clean Break can also deliver bespoke training for teams, drawing on 40 years of expertise working creatively with women.

NOTES TO EDITORS

Clean Break changes lives and changes minds through theatre – on stage, in prison and in the community. It produces ground-breaking plays with women writers and actors at the heart of its work. Founded in 1979 by two women prisoners who believed that theatre could bring the hidden stories of imprisoned women to a wider audience, it is still the only theatre company of its kind remaining true to these roots; inspiring playwrights and captivating audiences with the company's award winning plays on the complex theme of women and crime.

Its commissioned playwrights have included Zawe Ashton, Alice Birch, Deborah Bruce, Lin Coghlan, E V Crowe, Vivienne Franzmann, Tanika Gupta, Katie Hims, Sam Holcroft, Theresa Ikoko, Lucy Kirkwood, Chloë Moss, Rebecca Lenkiewicz, Winsome Pinnock and Rebecca Prichard.

Clean Break's 40th anniversary Season One included *Inside Bitch* at the Royal Court Theatre, *Belong* at Arcola Disruption Festival and Lyric Hammersmith Evolution Festival, and *All The Lights Are On*, the company's first collaboration with Cardboard Citizens. Other recent activity includes *Thick as Thieves* by Katherine Chandler, the company's first co-production with Theatr Clwyd which premiered on 17 October 2018, before a tour of UK theatre and prison tour; Alice Birch's *[BLANK]* - a co-commission with National Theatre Connections (which was performed by young people around the UK and at the National Theatre); participating in Artichoke's Processions project. In 2018, the company received a Tonic Award for its dedication to changing women's lives through theatre and commitment to new writing.

The Company is led by Joint Artistic Directors, **Anna Herrmann** and **Róisín McBrinn**, and Executive Director **Erin Gavaghan**.
