CLEAN BREAK: SPRING TO SUMMER 2021 A SEASON OF LIVE THEATRE, AUDIO AND FILM PRODUCTIONS, EXHIBITION, TRAINING AND EVENTS

After a year of online engagement, Clean Break announces a season of live and digital events celebrating and reconnecting its community of Members, artists and audiences. The company presents opportunities to experience live theatre in person, plays shared through audio and film, and an exhibition and digital timeline sharing the company's legacy. The season includes theatre from Ayesha Antoine, Deborah Bruce, Katherine Chandler, Sonya Hale, Morgan Lloyd Malcolm, Chloë Moss, and Clean Break Members.

Anna Herrmann and Roísín McBrinn, Joint Artistic Directors: "As we come out of a third lockdown and into what we hope are more optimistic times, we are delighted to share our new season. This season typifies our commitments for the future – an increased investment in our digital voice with a new short film and audio drama, a celebration of our campaigning roots with I am a theatre – our archive exhibition, and a desire to be back together to share live theatre in an outdoor production at our home in Kentish Town. We are especially proud that the season contains so much work created by, or in collaboration with, our Members. We look forward to being with our audiences online, in our building, and in Swiss Cottage Gallery – coming together again in all these spaces as brighter times begin."

Kat and Cherry meet on the streets. Kat is wily, funny, and fierce; Cherry is a lost dreamer. *Blis-ta* is the story of their adventures to survive as homeless girls and the transformative power of friendship.

Written by the late Sonya Hale, playwright and Clean Break Member, this is a wild tale of resilience, hidden homelessness, the lengths women go to for survival.

Blis-ta is directed by Róisín McBrinn, performed by Ambreen Razia and Ria Zmitrowicz, composition and sound design by Helen Skiera, and dramaturgy by Gillian Greer and produced by Mimi Findlay, with an introduction by Clean Break Patron, Lucy Kirkwood. It is accompanied by a live, online event discussing women and hidden homelessness on 19 May.

Three women sit in a prison van outside HMP Bronzefield, each caught up in their own worlds as they anticipate what's next. *Sweatbox* offers a glimpse into the experience of women as they are pulled away from their lives and transported to prison.

Chloë Moss's highly original Clean Break play has toured the UK in a prison van since its premiere at the Latitude Festival in 2015 and has been transformed into an electric adaptation for the screen.

Sweatbox is directed by Anna Herrmann, performed by Clean Break Members Funke Adeleke, Jade Small, Posy Sterling and Sarah-Jane Dent and produced by Quiet Storm, founders of *Create Not Hate*.

Clean Break's exhibition *I am a theatre* celebrates the company's 40-year history as a radical theatre company, documenting its heritage through previously unseen archival material and specially commissioned interviews and installations. Its title comes from a poem written by Abigail, a woman with lived experience of prison who contributed to Clean Break's 1987 project *Voices from Prison*.

The 40-year retrospective is co-designed by regular Clean Break collaborator Miriam Nabarro and Liz Whitbread, a designer and Member of Clean Break. Alongside the exhibition, Clean Break launches a digital timeline on its website and presents a programme of events including an online screening of co-founder Jacqueline Holborough's play *Killers*, recorded for Channel 4 in 1984, and workshops led by prominent Clean Break artists.

Over the last year women in prison have become more invisible than ever, locked in cells for up to 23 hours a day with visits and activities suspended. In July, Clean Break invites women from all 12 women's prisons to create work in this moment, amplify their words and let their experiences be heard.

Inspired by a project of the same name from 1987 uncovered in Clean Break's archive, selected pieces will be published and performed by a cast of actors and Member artists in *Voices from Prison*, an event shared online and across Clean Break's channels.

Alongside these public-facing events and activity, Clean Break continues to run its acclaimed Members' Programme (online and, planned from 7 June in person at its Kentish Town studios) providing a foundation of learning and skills in theatre performance, creativity and wellbeing as well as one-off masterclasses and events. With its partners at Advance Minerva and Women in Prison, the company will also provide creative workshops to women accessing Women's Centres over London.

In May, Clean Break launches the second Helen Pringle Award, an annual award in memory of Helen Pringle (Clean Break Senior Producer and Head of Finance, 2001-2017) who died in 2017. The award offers a £1000 bursary to support a Member in her Further/Higher Education and a mentorship by one of Clean Break's artistic community.
