Polly Frame and Siwan Morris have been cast in the roles of Gail and Karen in *Thick as Thieves*, a new play from Wales Drama Award winning playwright Katherine Chandler.

Directed by **Róisín McBrinn**, Joint Artistic Director of Clean Break, *Thick as Thieves* is the first ever co-production between Theatr Clwyd and Clean Break. Following its première at Theatr Clwyd, the production tours to Salisbury Playhouse and Hull Truck Theatre. The main theatrical tour will be followed by visits to three women's prisons across the country, accompanied by workshops enabling prison audiences to further explore the issues discussed in the play.

Two women from very different worlds: Karen has built a picture-perfect life while Gail struggles to keep hers together. When Gail re-enters Karen's life from out of the blue she brings with her everything Karen has been running from... This tense, revealing play explores what it means to care for one another and asks who, in a time of increasing disconnect, we expect to look after us.

Clean Break changes lives and changes minds through theatre – on stage, in prison and in the community. Founded in 1979 by two women prisoners, the acclaimed theatre company has recently unveiled a new three-women leadership team. Joint Artistic Directors Róisín McBrinn and Anna Herrmann, and Executive Director Erin Gavaghan will lead the company into an exciting 40th anniversary year in 2019 and beyond.

Theatr Clwyd is the largest producing theatre in Wales – a theatrical powerhouse with a rich history of homegrown productions over more than 4 decades. Now, led by the Executive team of Tamara Harvey and Liam Evans-Ford, it is going from strength to strength producing world class theatre, from new plays to classic revivals, and creating life changing work with, for and by its community.

NOTES TO EDITORS

Clean Break changes lives and changes minds through theatre – on stage, in prison and in the community. It produces ground-breaking plays with women writers and actors at the heart of its work. Founded in 1979 by two women prisoners who believed that theatre could bring the hidden stories of imprisoned women to a wider audience, it is still the only theatre company of its kind remaining true to these roots; inspiring playwrights and captivating audiences with the company's award winning plays on the complex theme of women and crime.

Its commissioned playwrights have included Zawe Ashton, Alice Birch, Deborah Bruce, Lin Coghlan, E V Crowe, Vivienne Franzmann, Tanika Gupta, Katie Hims, Sam Holcroft, Theresa Ikoko, Lucy Kirkwood, Chloë Moss, Rebecca Lenkiewicz, Winsome Pinnock and Rebecca Prichard.

Recent success for the company has included receiving a Tonic Award for its dedication to changing women's lives through theatre and commitment to new writing. As well as co-producing and touring Thick as Thieves, activity during 2018 has included Alice Birch's [BLANK] - a co-commission with National Theatre Connections (which was performed by young people around the UK and at the National Theatre); participating in Artichoke's Processions project; and Belong, created by a group of young women with Natasha Marshall, Clean Break's Channel 4 Playwright In Residence and winner of a Most Promising New Playwright Offie for *Half Breed*.

Theatr Clwyd is the largest producing theatre in Wales – a beacon of excellence looking across the Clwydian Hills yet only forty minutes from Liverpool. Since 1976 it has been a theatrical powerhouse and much-loved home for its community. Now, led by the Executive team of Tamara Harvey and Liam Evans-Ford, it is going from strength to strength producing world class theatre, from new plays to classic revivals, supported by an in-house team of workshop, wardrobe, scenic artists, props maker, and lighting and sound technicians. Its recent co-production of *Home, I'm Darling* with the National Theatre opened in Wales to great acclaim before going on to a sold out run in London. There are three theatre spaces, a cinema, café, bar and art galleries and, alongside

its own shows, it offers a rich and varied programme of visual arts, film, theatre, music, dance and comedy.

Theatr Clwyd works extensively with the community within its building and across North Wales. Alongside weekly companies of cross-generational theatre groups, it has also been recognised for its work in youth justice, its varied programme of arts, health and wellbeing, and for its growing raft of projects integrating its community in making the work on its stages and beyond.
